WHAT IS THE JAPANESE IMMERSION PROGRAM?

- The Japanese Immersion Program is a four year course which commences in Year 7 and continues in Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10.
- Students study Maths, Social Science, Multi-Media and Health & Physical Education in Japanese.
- The Maths, Social Science, Multi-Media and Health & Physical Education course follows the Australian Curriculum.
- The Multi-Media course covers computer applications and multi-media skills
- The curriculum content remains the same as mainstream courses but Immersion students receive instruction in Japanese.

WHY SHOULD NATIVE SPEAKERS CONSIDER ENROLLING in the JAPANESE IMMERSION PROGRAM?

- Delivery of lessons in Japanese will improve native speaker's understanding of lesson content
- Enrolment in the Japanese Immersion Program will help students enhance their understanding and value of their native culture
- Native Speaker Japanese ability will be improved in many ways: extension of vocabulary, grammatical understanding and kanji capability
- English language development will be supported because terminology and lesson content must be **UNDERSTOOD** in Japanese but is usually **EXPLAINED/ANSWERED** by students in English
- Native speakers will be studying with Australian students that value Japanese language and culture

NOTE: Only a small number of native speakers are accepted into our program each year.
