## **Program Overview**

Robina State High School is committed to a full implementation of BYO device in 2024 and beyond.

All students in **Years 7–12** must have their own device that meets the **minimum specifications** to access our network, resources, and curriculum.

BYOD recognises that different learners have different needs; **one device does not suit everyone**.

Devices are integrated into day-to-day learning. Most subjects use a **OneNote Class Notebook** with resources, videos, and links in one place and/or **QLearn** for short courses and some content delivery.

### Benefits of BYOD @ Robina SHS

- Improves access to web-based research
- Lifts digital literacy for teachers and students
- Shifts towards knowledge construction, not just content delivery
- Extends learning beyond the classroom
- Builds appropriate and ethical online behaviour
- Enables personalisation and continuous access to learning materials
- Increases feedback and consultation opportunities with teachers
- Provides engaging, interactive learning environments
- Strengthens home-school links for parent engagement
- Lets students bring prior knowledge and co-construct learning
- Access to rich media and communication tools to collaborate locally/globally
- Supports development of 21st-century skills and high productivity

## What Device?

Families choose and purchase a **primary learning device** that meets the specifications below. Our IT team will diagnose issues and advise on next steps (e.g., warranty/insurance). Students at school receive:

- Filtered internet (filtered approved content only)
- Access to classroom content
- School printers



Consider size and weight for daily carry.

We **cannot recommend a particular brand/model** due to the Public Sector Ethics Act 1994 (objective, independent, apolitical, impartial advice).

## Examples of Devices that Meet General Minimum Specs

- Lenovo IdeaPad 1i 14" Windows 11, Intel, 4 GB RAM, 128 GB, 14", 11-hr battery
- Acer Aspire 3 Spin 14" (2-in-1) Windows 11, Intel, 8 GB RAM, 128 GB SSD, 14", 8-hr battery
- **HP Pavilion x360 14"** Windows 11, Intel, 8 GB RAM, 256 GB, 14", 8-hr battery
- MacBook Air 13" macOS, 8 GB RAM, 256 GB SSD, 13", 18-hr battery

## Not compliant Devices:

- Chromebooks
- Android Devices

NOTE: Currently Base Level Microsoft Co-Pilot PCs (Snapdragon) are incompatible with printing and some Adobe Products.

Devices below minimum may have **connectivity issues** and limited access to curriculum/software.



# iPads (for Years 7–9 Only & Not Recommended as Primary Device)

Students in **Years 7–9** may use an existing iPad but must understand the **limitations**:

• Cellular models **not recommended** (unfiltered internet; distraction risk)

#### **Capabilities & Limitations:**

**Recommended iPad extras:** detachable keyboard, stylus/smart pencil, protective cover, extended warranty (AppleCare), accidental damage protection.

## Required Software (All Devices)

#### Microsoft Office 365 (free via MIS ID/password):

- 1. Go to mis.eq.edu.au
- 2. Click **App Launcher** (top-left)
- 3. Click Office 365
- 4. Click **Install Office** (top-right)

## Note: This won't be possible until the student has been issued a EQ username and password

#### **Suggested Additional Software:**

- PDF Reader: Adobe Acrobat Reader
- Browsers: Google Chrome; Mozilla Firefox
- Video: VLC Media Player
- Audio: Audacity
- Adobe Design Suite: licensed for subjects requiring it (PC/Mac). Students requiring Adobe will be issued a Licence by the school.



## Digital Literacy @ Robina

Primary platform: MS OneNote Class Notebook.

- Students may also use eLearning sites and Turnitin (Years 10–12).
- Students may also use QLearn for some short courses and content delivery
- Parents can view learning content/resources in OneNote.

#### OneNote — Key How-Tos:

- Access first time via **teacher email link** → Open in app (OneNote Desktop/2016)
- OR via <u>owa.eq.edu.au</u> → Tiles → OneNote → Shared with Me → Open in Desktop App
- **Sign in** with school email (e.g., jsmit1@eq.edu.au)
- Sync: Right-click Notebook title → **Sync This Notebook Now** (green sync icon)
- Navigate: Collaboration Space, Content Library, your section; green "back" button returns to Notebook list
- Switch Notebooks: Click OneNote title → list others; pin list if desired; close old notebooks (right-click → Close This Notebook)

## Digital Citizenship & Online Safety

- Build a positive online reputation; mirror normal interpersonal expectations
- Passwords: Unique, confidential; change when prompted/compromised; log off shared desktops
- Email: Department email for learning; monitored for appropriateness
- Internet Filtering: Only on school Wi-Fi; no personal 3G/4G use on campus
- eSafety: esafety.gov.au and esafety.gov.au/iparent

## Device Care, Backup, Insurance & Warranty

- Backups: Weekly (external drive; Windows Backup or macOS Time Machine) and / or Backup to school OneDrive Cloud storage
- Care: Bring fully charged, labelled device; use sleep mode when moving
- Case/Carry Bag: Strong, padded case/bag
- **Insurance:** Consider accidental damage cover; clarify inclusions
- Warranty: Extended warranty recommended; Average lifespan ~3 years
- **Repairs & Maintenance:** Family responsibility; Based on Warranty and Purchase Agreement
- **Security:** Stay with devices; use lockers when not needed; only use in class with teacher support



## School Support & BYOD Policy

- IT staff diagnose issues, can fix any school based software issues and advise on warranty/insurance
